




There is a lot of sunshine this month as we highlight many of our quilters who have achieved awards. Congratulations go to **Grace Errea** on winning a 1st place award for her quilt, "Sunset on the Beach," for Landscape Design at the AQS Show, which was held at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel in Tennessee. Grace has had quilts published in two books. Her quilt, "The Leaves" or "Life after the Storm," is published in "Contemporary Quilts" by Cindy Walter and Stevie Graves and is on page 79. Her other quilt, "Jessie," is in "Fabric Art Gallery," published by Banar Designs. Both these quilts are hanging in Material Possessions. Many, many congratulations to Grace on these fabulous accomplishments.

More congratulations to several members who have quilts traveling with the Hoffman Challenge. **Irmagard Terbrack's** quilt "Spring Morning" took 1st place as a first-time entry in the Mixed Textile Category; **Susan Trindle's** quilt, "Shattered," is traveling with the show as is **Diane Russell's** wearable art jacket. **Becky Reed** donated a golf-themed quilt called "St. Andrews in Pieces" to the Rick Wakeman Annual Celebrity Golf Tournament, Gala Dinner, Concert and Auction to benefit Sparks Children's Research Hospital of London Charity." The quilt was in shades of red, green and yellow and based on a Lyn Mann Mystery pattern. A print of early 20th century golfers was fussy-cut for the central squares on point. It was machine-pieced and hand-appliquéd, embroidered and quilted. There was a reserve put on it of the equivalent of \$750.00. Becky was hoping it would at least make the reserve. The actual auction price, converted to dollars, was \$4000.00. Our hats are off to all these ladies and their wonderful work.

ALL WHO MADE PAT'S PRESIDENT'S QUILT

It certainly takes a guild to make a president's quilt. I want to thank all of you whose work is in the quilt we will be giving to Pat at the October Guild meeting. The Guild design team of Diane Collins, Jan Hirth, Maggie Ezell, and Lyndy Dye created a wonderful design to showcase all of the wonderful blocks that were turned in. Many hardworking volunteers came to sew blocks together, back the signature blocks, make 4 patches, etc. Special thanks to Janet Cowart for sewing the rows together and then coming to my house for super sewing one panicky morning. Seventeen quilters gathered at Leah's for basting the pieces down and then adding them to the quilt. Special thanks to Donna Bradshaw who machine-appliquéd the "black stuff" on the sides and to Nancy Ota for hand appliquéing the sign. Lyndy's skillful embroidery and design skills are showcased on the logo. Every quilt needs a back, and Sheryl Smith-Bailey's back art is exquisite. Karen Wendel coordinated the details and brought a dozen people together to baste. Polly Hada did all the beautiful embroidery. My favorite go-fer Julie Greenspan handled the details of all the quilting bees and got the quilt to our wonderful hostesses Sheryl Smith-Bailey, Tanya Goffman, Barbara Trulis, Debbie Kulick, and Maggie Ezell. My wonderful neighbor Diane Imhoof answered my call to produce yards of bias on three hours notice. No quilt is finished till the binding is sewed down, and Nancy McBride beautifully finished this task. Karen Wendell and Collette McManus recorded all this work in a scrapbook to be presented along with the quilt.

However, none of this work could have been done without the creative blocks created by over 100 guild members and all the quilters who came for 5 weeks to complete Pat's wonderful quilt. What a great guild!


Block Party

Hospitality


Many thanks to the gals from Material Possessions for hosting our Hospitality Table for **September**. They are great group of gals and we enjoyed all their help.

HURRICANE KATRINA RELIEF

The destruction that was caused by Hurricane Katrina is mind boggling and the outpouring of agencies and groups wanting to help the victims is overwhelming and very heart warming. As I mentioned at the September meeting, I have had many e-mails with information about different ways in which we can help. I have listed them with a bit of information about who they are and what it is they are requesting.

KATRINA'S KIDS CHRISTMAN CHALLENGE: Susan Nash, a former member of Beach Cities, who now lives in Texas, has sent us a "challenge." Her Texas guild, The Woodlands Area Quilt Guild, is asking all Texas guilds to "challenge" a sister guild in another state to make Christmas stockings for Katrina's Kids. Christmas will be here before we know it, and the children will need some cheer. Families have lost everything, so trying to give their children a Christmas will probably be impossible. We don't want the children to be forgotten. They are asking interested members to make and send children's Christmas stockings, along with a \$5.00 donation which the Woodland Area Quilt Guild will use to buy presents to fill the stockings. They will be distributed to the evacuated children who have sought refuge in the Houston area.

Nancy Ota had the pattern and instructions at the September meeting. Your response to this request at that meeting has been fantastic. Here is your chance to use some of your Christmas fabric stash. These stockings can be as simple or elaborate as you want. You can bring your finished stockings and donations to our October and November meetings and we will send them off in bulk. If you didn't get a pattern, they will be available at the October and November meetings (Oct. 13 and Nov.10), at the October 21st Philanthropy meeting (at this time, no Philanthropy meeting is scheduled in November due to Thanksgiving), and via e-mail to Nancy Ota (nancy@nancyota.com). The pattern is simply a guide; the stockings can be larger or smaller. If you have a pattern you would like to use, by all means, do so. If sending a check, please make it out to WAQG.

WAQG would like to receive the stockings and donations by December 1st so they have time to buy the presents, fill the stockings and distribute them. QUILTERS COMFORT AMERICA: This group is sponsored by International Quilt Festival in Houston. They are requesting donations of quilts, usable sheets and blankets. Just for information, 300 boxes of quilts and linens from QUILTERS CONFORT AMERICA arrived in Houston this week. When they were delivered, the looks of appreciation were priceless.

BINKY PATROL: Karen Carter is the project liaison for the North Orange County Chapter of Binky Patrol, and they are working on a special blanket project for the children and infants who are victims of Hurricane Katrina. 
